LED STEER OR HEIFER ON HOOF

Judging: Hoof Judging, handling and junior judging competitions are on Thursday, October 22nd commencing at 10.00am (this is the day prior to the show commencing).

Closing Date for Entries – Friday 25th September at 4.00pm

Cost - \$20.00 per entry

Membership: All Exhibitors must be members of the Mt Gambier A & H Society Inc. Single Adult Membership: \$30 (applicable for schools).

Ribbons: Ribbons to be presented to 1st, 2nd & 3rd place getters in each class. Sashes presented for Champion and Reserve Champion Steer or Heifer on Hoof, Best Prepared Steer or Heifer, Steer or Heifer on Hook and Grand Champion Steer or Heifer scoring highest aggregate points on Hoof & Hook. Sashes also awarded for Champion Novice Handler & Champion Handler.

Prize money: 1st \$20, 2nd \$10 for hoof classes. Hook prize money is yet to be finalised

PLEASE NOTE:

Prize money will be paid electronically to the nominated bank account within 14 days for all steer/heifer classes.

Hook results to be announced by email with ribbons presented to school after the event.

Conditions of entry:

- 1. Steers or heifers should still have their milk teeth (but 2 teeth accepted under 21mths of age).
- 2. Schools have had their steers or heifers on site for at least 3 months.
- 3. Steers or heifers can be stud or commercial animals.
- 4. Steers or heifers must be in good health whilst exhibiting.
- 5. Steers or heifers are J-Bas Score 6 or above.
- 6. Steers or heifers are Pesti Virus tested and return negative results.
- 7. Exhibitors need to be MSA accredited through LPA
- 8. Students entering the Novice Handler Competition who did not enter our competition last year or a similar competition in the preceding 12 months.
- 9. Students entering the Handler Competition to have entered into the handler competition last year or have competed in a similar competition in other shows in the past 12 months.
- 10. NLIS tags <u>must be</u> attached to animals.
- 11. Vendor Declaration and MSA declaration must be presented at time of weighing.
- 12. A national cattle health declaration must be submitted with entry forms.
- 13. Exhibitors are to supply their own water and feed bins. Bedding supplied-no straw.
- 14. Exhibitors are to have stalls cleaned out and waste removed to the designated area following judging.

LED STEER OR HEIFER ON HOOK

Judging: Judging for the hook section will take place on Friday 23rd October. This will be at Teys Bros Naracoorte using the MSA grading.

Teys Bros will purchase bodies at the current grid price.

Steer weight and categories – live – divided up according to numbers into lightweight and heavy weight.

Steers judged on the hook specifications:

	Weight (kg)	P8 Fat	Rib Fat
Lightweight	<280	6-12	4-9
Heavyweight	>280	9-17	7-12

Hoof and hook results will be combined to determine the overall placings. Champion steer or heifer on hoof and hook will be announced via email with ribbons presented following the event.
