Entries Close - means your entry form along with payment must be presented at the Secretaries office Mt Gambier A&H Society by mail, or in person.

Exhibits- means the actual item that you are entering into the competition, Exhibits are not required to be presented when entering, please check date and time for each section carefully.

Once items are staged they cannot be removed from the bench

CONDITIONS for POT PLANTS: Pot Plants need to have been owned by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) Calendar months prior to exhibiting. Pots must be clean.

- a.** Pots not to exceed 60cms unless otherwise stated
- b.** Plants must be DISTINCT unless otherwise stated
- c.** Exhibits of inferior quality not necessarily awarded a prize
- d.** Only the plant to be judged in the pot (no weeds

or decorative under planting)

e. Pots are to be free of livestock e.g. mealy bug, aphid & snails

f. If an exhibit is staged with a contaminant it will be removed or asked to be removed
