SHOW HALL Opening Times for public viewing Horticulture: 1.00pm to 7.00pm Friday & 9.00am to 5:00 Saturday.

CONDITIONS for POT PLANTS: Pot Plants need to have been owned by the Exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) Calendar months prior to exhibiting. Pots must be clean.

**a.** Pots not to exceed 60cms unless otherwise stated

- b. Plants must be DISTINCT unless otherwise stated
- **c.** Exhibits of inferior quality not necessarily awarded a prize
- **d.** Only the plant to be judged in the pot (no weeds or decorative under planting)
- **e.** Pots are to be free of livestock e.g. mealy bug, aphid & snails
- **f.** If an exhibit is staged with a contaminant it will be removed or asked to be removed
